#### **Everyday Stewardship**

When I was a teenager, I had an experience that truly changed my life and helped me to give Jesus all of myself. I had been baptized Catholic and always had faith, but it took a specific event to really shake me out of the comfort of my life and set me on a path devoted to God. I didn't get knocked off a horse or find an open tomb, but for me it was powerful enough to make a huge impact.

Testimonies of how people came to live as intentional disciples have great power. Often the stories do not include singular events or people; instead they speak of a gradual unfolding of faith. It is often the culmination of several events and the work of more than one person that brings a person to the point of real decision.

Living as good stewards, we can help move people forward in their journey with God. Giving of ourselves freely can move human hearts like few other forces. God working through us can bring others to see that simply saying that Jesus is the Savior of the world does not mean we live our lives differently. It takes more thought and reflection on our part to move past words to intentional acts with intentional results. I don't know if all those involved in that event when I was a teenager knew what an effect their good stewardship would have on me, but I am so thankful they provided a way for God to touch me. I have spent my entire life trying to pay them back by allowing God to touch others through me. Just what person might God touch through you today?

### St. Egeria the Pilgrim

#### The Liturgy of the Word - Part 3: Profession of Faith and Universal Prayer

A frequent misunderstanding is that we say a long "prayer" after the

Sunday homily. The creed (from the Latin *credo*, "I believe") we recite is not a prayer but rather a listing of beliefs.

In the centuries after Pentecost, Christians attempted to find precise language to express their faith. Growth of the Church in numbers and geography led to some conflicting beliefs by local communities, especially about Jesus. These discrepancies occasionally led to violence and resulted in the Council of Nicea (325) and later the Council Constantinople (381), where bishops articulated a more precise account of who Jesus is. The Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed expresses what these councils taught. It was added after the homily to demonstrate our common faith in the Triune God.

In the Universal Prayer, or Prayer of the Faithful, those gathered offer prayers to God for the salvation of all. Petitions are usually offered for holy Church, for those who govern, for those weighed down by various needs, for all humanity, and for the salvation of the whole world. Here we give voice together for the most fundamental intentions of God's Church on earth.

In this part of the Liturgy of the Word, the Church is united in faith and prayer!



### 1914-1920



Father Michael Hefferman replaced Father McGinley at St. Patrick's Parish in May 1914. At that time the Parish was in debt and needed repairs. Fr. Hefferman met with his parishioners and collected the funds within a week to paint the interior and exterior of the church. One parishioner had the pews varnished and the floor painted at his own expense. Later repairs were made in the convent and additional work was done in the church.

During Fr. Hefferman's years in the Fort Hamilton community a complete gymnasium and sports program were set up in the basement of the school. Dramatics



also were important in the parish. There was an organized drum corps, cadet corps, and a brass band. In 1917 a new convent was built to house the Dominican Sisters who taught in the school. It was located behind the church at 418 95th Street, on the same site as the first convent.


