

Be on alert for people claiming to represent:

- \Rightarrow Government agencies and utilities
- ⇒ Banks and retail companies
- \Rightarrow Dating app connections

Safety Tips:

- \Rightarrow Don't respond to unknown calls or texts
- \Rightarrow Use official website to submit information
- \Rightarrow Don't let others use your phone
- \Rightarrow Be aware of your surroundings
- \Rightarrow Check in with family about scams
- \Rightarrow Only use gift cards for shopping, not payments
