### **Embracing Change in Christ**

It's officially one month since we popped the champagne, toasted 2021 and wrote down a list of resolutions. This is usually the time when we start to take a good, hard look in the mirror to assess what we have done — or have not done — with the first month of this brand-new year.

New years can be scary, can't they? Full of promise, sure, but also full of room for failure. Full of space for our old baggage, old fears and the continuation of old mistakes.

The same can be said of Christ, and the new life he offers us, if we are brave enough to accept it. Opportunities like that can be intimidating. ### The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord Commonly called **Candlemas**


### Friday, February 2nd

### Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th,



We want to be ready to really take off on that day, rather than just beginning to think about Lent on that day. Part of what makes a vacation or a special anniversary so special is the build-up to it.

Taking some time to get ready for Lent will ensure that we aren't going to miss the first week or two of Lent, because we are just getting

Before we get to Ash Wednesday, we should start asking ourselves some questions and we should start with some preparations. "What does God want to give me this year?" This question may require that we slow down a bit and *listen* to our inner spirit.



### Egeria the Pilgrim

The content you'll find in this space in the coming weeks and months is inspired by the holy woman Egeria who made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem in the 380s AD. Egeria was not an

abbess or a nun, but a lay woman who was, like many pilgrims today, very curious about what happened at the various services of the shrines in the Holy Land. While she might have been a bit wealthier than many of us, allowing her to make her lengthy pilgrimage, she simply wanted to share as much of her experience as she could with her friends back home. So, she took detailed notes that are now some of the first and best accounts of the rituals that took place in the local Church of Jerusalem.

This space will be an opportunity for us to explore, like Egeria, the worship space, rituals, customs, and other themes that we encounter, not on the other side of the world but in our own church each time we participate at the Sacred Mysteries. Egeria's life was changed by her experience. So, too, will our lives be transformed when we actively, knowingly, and faithfully join in the Sunday celebration and beyond.



### Sunday Celebration

From the Church's very beginnings, believers have

followed the Lord's Last Supper command: "Do this in memory of me." His Apostles and first followers, who were mostly Jews and perhaps a bit unsure about their newfound place in salvation history, initially continued attending synagogue during the week. Nevertheless, they gathered each Sunday to commemorate the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus. "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers" (Acts 2:42).

After their profession of Christ Crucified and Risen, nothing was more important for them than the Sunday celebration. For almost two millennia now, Sunday after Sunday, our ancestors in the Faith have followed that simple and straightforward command of the Lord Jesus. In the present age, many distractions vie for our attention each weekend. Yet Christians have always had demands on their time. Strenuous labors to provide basic food and shelter used to fill their days from before dawn until after sunset. While today's distractions are often more about rest and fun than hard work, every child, woman, and man who follows Jesus needs to hear anew His words: "Do this in memory of me."


