O Diving Mercy

The message of Divine Mercy Devotion calls people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone.

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Sunday following Easter Sunday and is a devotion that centers on the mercy of God. This devotion was popularized by St. Faustina Kowalska, who received messages from Jesus in the 1930s regarding His Divine Mercy. The devotion involves praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, which is a prayer that asks for God's mercy and forgiveness.

Divine Mercy Sunday Offers the Opportunity for Grace

Divine Mercy Sunday is also a day where Catholics can receive special graces and blessings. According to the diary of St. Faustina, those who receive Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday and confess their sins within eight days before or after the day can obtain a plenary indulgence, which removes all temporal punishment due to sin.

Today we will celebrate **The Feast of Divine Mercy** with a Holy Hour that will include Benediction and Recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00 pm in the Church.

The Annunciation of the Lord

While The Annunciation always falls on March 25th the celebration of the feast is transferred to a different date if it falls on a Sunday of Lent, during Holy Week, or during the octave of Easter. When the Annunciation falls on a Sunday in Lent (before Palm Sunday), it is

transferred to the following Monday. If it falls on Palm Sunday (as it did this year) or on any day in Holy Week, it is transferred to the Monday after the Sunday after Easter.

Month of the Holy Eucharist

Since the Easter Season covers the whole month of April. April is dedicated to the Holy Eucharist. During the month of April, Catholics are encouraged to



deepen their devotion to the Eucharist through various practices, such as attending Eucharistic Adoration and participating in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Eucharistic Adoration is a practice that involves spending time in prayer and contemplation in front of the Blessed Sacrament, which is a consecrated host that represents the real presence of Christ. This practice allows Catholics to deepen their relationship with Christ and express their love and gratitude for His sacrifice.



The Liturgy of the Word – Part One: The Readings – A

Not surprisingly, during the Liturgy of the Word, we are presented with a lot of words, and it helps if we understand what they are. On Sundays, Solemnities, and Feasts of Our Lord, four Scripture passages are proclaimed: readings from the Old Testament, the Psalms, the New Testament, and the Gospels.

The custom of the First Reading coming from the Hebrew Scriptures began in the early Church. The disciples, after all, were Jewish and acknowledged Jesus as the Messiah. In the season of Easter, it is replaced by a reading from Acts of the Apostles, demonstrating the bond between the Resurrected Lord and his first followers.

The Responsorial Psalm that follows should ideally be sung. It is called "responsorial" not only because it has a response in it but also because its text and theme most often points back or responds to the First Reading.

The Second Reading or Epistle comes from one of the New Testament letters.

The Liturgy of the Word culminates with the Gospel, which we give special reverence by preceding it with an acclamation (usually "Alleluia") and then standing to listening as it is proclaimed.

Learning continues inside the classrooms as students read novels discussing the Holocaust and study World War II in social studies. Students created a video for this event in which their learning was highlighted.
